

Camden County High School recently earned three top Advanced Placement (AP) honors awarded by the Georgia Department of Education. CCHS was designated as an AP STEM School, AP STEM Achievement School and AP Humanities School. Camden County High School currently offers 19 AP courses. By offering a broad range of AP courses, students are able to explore areas of interest and develop college-level academic skills while having the opportunity to earn college credit prior to graduation. AP exams are administered by the College Board, which also administers the SAT. Students who receive a 3, 4, or 5 on an AP exam may receive college credit.

The honor of AP STEM School is awarded to schools with students testing in at least two AP math courses and two AP science courses. AP STEM Achievement Schools are schools with students testing in at least two AP math courses and two AP science courses and at least 40 percent of exam scores on AP math and science exams earning scores of 3 or higher. The designation of AP Humanities School are schools with students testing in at least one English/Language Arts course, two social science courses, one fine arts course and one world language course.

The honor of being designated as an AP Award School is a testament to the hard work and determination of our AP teachers and students. Earning this recognition reflects our commitment to prepare students for academic success beyond the halls of Camden County High School.
