

CPTC Dual Enrollment Student Quick Facts



● Dual Enrollment Changes beginning Summer 2020:

- ◆ The new Dual Enrollment (DE) law states that students can only take up to 30 credit hours of DE funded courses. Past DE Credit Hours WILL count towards the 30 hour cap. If you currently have 19 or more DE funded credit hours, then you will be allotted an additional 12 hours of DE funded courses.

● Eligibility based on the 2020-2021 School Year:

- ◆ **9th Graders:** Not eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment Funding Program. However, eligible 9th graders may pay for the courses themselves.

- ◆ **10th Graders:** Eligible students may only enroll in approved Technical Courses OR have a qualifying SAT or ACT score that is approved by the Georgia Student Finance Commission for General Education Courses.*

Current 10th graders enrolled as a DE student during the 2019-2020 school year are eligible to receive DE funding for both CTAE and General Education courses.

- ◆ **11th and 12th Graders:** Eligible students may enroll in any approved General Education or Technical courses.

● Admissions Requirements for CPTC Dual Enrollment Students:

1. DE students who have not previously taken courses with CPTC, need to complete the online Dual Enrollment Admissions Application here: <https://applydual.tcsg.edu/>

A paper Admissions application is also available upon request.

- When you are completing the admissions application, please make sure that you include your Social Security number and the high school you currently attend. If this information is not included, you will NOT be registered for classes with CPTC.

2. Complete the GA Student Finance Commission's Dual Enrollment Funding Application here: www.gafutures.org

- If you do not already have a GA Futures account, you will need to create one before completing the funding application.

3. Parent or guardian of the DE student will need to sign the Dual Enrollment Funding Waiver Agreement available here: http://www.coastalpines.edu/assets/1/7/Dual_Enrollment_Funding_Waiver_Agreement-Electronic_Signature.pdf

- Once completed and signed, please submit to: dualenrollment@coastalpines.edu or the student's CPTC High School representative.

4. Make sure all testing requirements have been met (SAT, ACT, Accuplacer, HOPE GPA, etc).*

5. Meet with CPTC High School representative or High School Counselor to schedule classes for the upcoming semester.

*Due to COVID-19, all testing requirements have been waived for the Fall 2020 semester.
