JOINTLY DEVELOPED

The parents, students, and staff of Camden County High School partnered together to develop this school-parent compact for achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added input about the types of support they needed, and students told us what would help them learn. Parents were encouraged to attend annual revision meetings held August 14, 2017 to review the compact and make suggestions based on student needs and school improvement goals. Parents were also encouraged to participate in the annual Title I parent survey that is also used as a tool to collect parent feedback regarding the current Title I programs and policies.

To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

CAMDEN COUNTY SCHOOLS GOALS:

-To increase the percentage of all students designated as proficient or higher on the ELA GMAS from 51% in 2017 to 54% in 2018, 57% in 2019, and 60% in 2020.

-To increase the percentage of all students designated as proficient or higher on the Math GMAS from 55% in 2017 to 58% in 2018, 61% in 2019, and 64% in 2020

CAMDEN COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL GOALS:

To increase performance in all EOC (End of Course) content areas by 3% by targeting the foundational skills of

- 1- Reading comprehension – acquire and use new vocabulary***
- 2- Effective writing strategies – citing strong explicit evidence in analysis***
- 3- Mathematical Practice – construct viable arguments and critique the reasoning of others***

Provide parents with strategies to support student learning at home.

- Teachers will provide access to online textbooks and Google Classrooms, when available, to encourage parents to become familiar with the content for their course
- Parents will receive information about how to access digital learning resources to support their students’ learning at home, such as tutorial videos, USA TestPrep, Khan Academy student learning platform, and Georgia Virtual School online resources
- Hold Parent Information Nights during the school year to provide information to parents on state academic standards, testing and test preparation, dual enrollment opportunities, Advanced Placement courses, and the college application process.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Ask my child to read newspaper, magazine, or online articles and discuss them with my child.
- Assist my child in studying by helping to review vocabulary, class notes or study guides, or find someone else to assist.
- Will encourage my child to offer evidence used in forming his/her opinions.

- I will work to attain mastery by getting extra help when needed.
- I will take advantage of opportunities for revision and reassessment.
- I will stay on task to use my time and technology productively for learning.
- I will read a variety of print content for information (newspaper, magazine, online articles, cell phone plan contracts, insurance policies, etc.).


