Advisors will distribute final exam exemption reports to advisory class. These forms have been placed in your mailbox 2. Students will check the box acknowledging which classes they are <i>requesting</i> to exempt 3. Students will sign, date, and write a working parent phone number 4. Once completed the advisory teacher will collect and verify each form based on the exemption guidelines located at the bottom of each form. 5. Advisory teacher will separate the forms into 3 stacks: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stack 1-forms that include students that have been verified eligible (by

advisor) to exempt all 4 blocks

- Stack 2-forms that were not completed (absent students)
- Stack 3-all other forms

****ADVISORY TEACHER (NOT STUDENTS) WILL RETURN THE COMPLETED FORMS TO STUDENT INFORMATION AND SIGN OFF! *Forms can be dropped off throughout the day, including after school!***

***If a student is exempt from all final exams, they do not have to attend school on 5/22 and 5/23. If a student is required to take 1 or more final exams they must attend school on 5/22 and 5/23. Students exempt from a single exam will be allowed to go to the cafeteria during that exam period.*

1. Summer 2018 CCHS Credit Redemption Registration (form attached)

Program Dates: May 29, 2018 – July 13, 2018

Deadline to register: Jun 7, 2018

*Credit redemption is for students to make up a course in which they FAILED. There is no score cut off. It's for any academic failed course. It cost \$100. All EOC subjects will take an EOC as a final test. EOC testing will take place on July 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th. All course work must be finished by July 13th for credit to be issue before school begins. **ANY WORK COMPLETED AFTER THAT DAY IS NOT ACCEPTED!***

All Credit Redemption courses will be taken using the online software program Edgenuity. The High School Media center will be open Monday through Thursday from 8 – 12 from May 29th to June 28th for additional help and if internet access is not available at home.

2. Summer 2018 Course Extension Registration (form attached)

This program is for NON EOC COURSES.

Program Dates: May 29, 2018 – June 28, 2018

Deadline to register: Jun 7, 2018

The Course Extension Program offers a student who failed an academic (NON EOC) core course 2nd Semester with a grade of 60-69 an opportunity to add points to bring that grade to a maximum 70. This also cost \$100 and can pay in payments.

EOC TUTORING Program (form Attached)</p> <p>Dates: June 4 through June 28</p> <p><i>Students will be tutored Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. in the High School building from Jun 4 till June 21. Students need to report to the High School on June 4th to receive classroom locations. Students who participate in the tutoring program for a failed EOC will be allowed to retake the EOC during the last week of June (6/25-6/28). Passing scores on the EOC are a CCHS Graduation Requirement. Students who participate in the remediation program have a greater chance to improve their EOC score. Passing the EOC will also increase their final average for course. If the class grade is between a 60 to a 69 before the tutoring program, student will also receive credit for that class. THIS PROGRAM IS FREE and we encourage everyone who failed an EOC to participate.</i></p>
