The scholarship is presented in memory of Charles & Mary Ellen Hollosy who as members of the Camden County community made significant contributions in time and financial support to aid those residents of Camden County who have Alzheimer's, support current and future caregivers; and wished to continue their legacy by providing financial aid to students who are pursuing a career in a field related to Alzheimer's/Dementia care, treatments, or research.

Please note the following eligibility criteria:

- 1) Student must be a graduating senior of the CCHS Class of 2024.
- 2) Student must have completed Health & Environmental Science Academy Pathway in EMT, Patient Care, or Pharmacy at CCHS.
- 3) Student must provide proof of acceptance to one of the educational institutions above.
- 4) Student must completely and accurately fill out the application package.
- 5) Student must include 1 letter of recommendation (see below).
- 6) Any applications that are incomplete or late will not be reviewed.

Please include the following in your application package:

- Scholarship Application (including personal history and essay)
- Acceptance Letter from College, University, or Vocational/Technical School
- One Recommendation Letter- Letter must be sealed with letter writer's initials on the outside of the envelope. Letters is to be from- A CCHS academic teacher (Pathway teachers are not acceptable as references.)

NOTE: All scholarship money will be used towards payments for books and academic fees. A check will be disbursed to the Bursars office of the institution they will be attending.
