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SCAVENGER HUNT – Positive Social Norms

Advisor will read aloud the following:

Making healthy and positive decisions in our everyday lives is key to personal success. Many times, choosing positive habits or positive social norms can improve our mental and physical health. A positive social norm is defined as standards or expectations for youth's attitudes and behaviors that are considered socially and culturally appropriate and desirable. A Positive Social Norms Campaign is one way to clarify certain misperceptions of norms and promote positive social norms or (behavior). For example, let's say that many high school students think that the majority of people their age drink. If teens think everyone

drinks or most drink, they might feel greater pressure to drink. However, in reality, most high school students don't drink. The purpose of a social norming campaign is to change the students' attitudes, behavior and perception about drinking by communicating the truth that the majority do not drink. You may have noticed the various "92% Don't Drink" posters throughout CCHS this year. Based on a recent survey, it was reported that 92% of CCHS students do not drink. There are also several "93% Don't Vape" posters located throughout CCHS. We will be holding a scavenger hunt throughout the day today on Wednesday, April 24th directly after advisory.

A green smiley face sticker will be hidden throughout the entire campus on various posters.
