PAWS	Positive Social Norming	Promote Positive Social Norms: Rise Above the Yape Temptation.	
Date Jan. 24		All groups of people develop social norms. These norms are expectations for specific behavior communicated among group members to help create a shared culture and organize group behavior.	
		Among youth, norms are commonly communicated through peers (e.g., friends, dating, acquaintances), parents, teachers, media (e.g., television, music, social media, etc.), community members, and many other ways. Fostering positive social norms is often a primary goal in schools and youth development programs. Positive social norms are defined as standards or expectations for youth's attitudes and behaviors that are considered socially and culturally appropriate and desirable. Positive social norms often promote behaviors viewed as safe, healthy, and morally or ethically valued (e.g., volunteering, school attendance). They also discourage unhealthy, risky, or deviant behaviors (e.g., substance use, violence, risky behavior) among today's youth. Making healthy and positive decisions in our everyday lives is key to personal success. Many times, choosing positive habits or positive social norms can improve our mental and physical health. In partnership with Camden Connection, CCHS is implementing a Positive Social Norms Campaign as a way to clarify certain misperceptions of norms and promote positive social norms or (behavior). For example, let's say that many high school students think that the majority of people their age vape. If teens think everyone or almost everyone vapes, they might feel greater pressure to begin vaping. However, in reality, most high school students don't vape. The purpose of a social norming campaign is to change the students' attitudes, behavior and perception about vaping by communicating the truth that the majority do not vape.
